Approximately 5,000 children are born with this deformity in the United States each year. This problem occurs when facial soft and hard tissues fail to fuse properly. This happens to one of every 750 live births causing conditions that affect, not only the child's appearance and self esteem, but the child's ability to speak, hear, and eat properly. In 2005, Shriner's Hospitals added this program which is a long-term commitment of care from birth to adolescence.

Waiting for A Change

We awaited Smith Lake Jake, Staten Island Chuck, General Beauregard Lee, Shubenacadie Sam, Warton Willie, and Punxsutawney Phil to make the annual appearances on Ground Hog Day to predict if winter will end soon or if we will have six more weeks of cold and snowy weather. Now, we must begin to consider **whether or not our 22 Shriners Hospitals**

for Children will continue to exist as we know them today.

This thought was made inescapably clear by Shriners Hospitals for Children President and CEO Douglas E. Maxwell in his January message to our Nobility. Chairman Douglas stated:

"This is why the question has to continue to be asked of each of us – "with medical costs in America continuing to outpace our growth of income, can we continue to have 22 hospitals, in their present form, to balance the budget without going into the principle of the Endowment Fund to accomplish this?... The mission of this new Strategic Task Force is to determine what we can do that both makes sense and eliminates deficit spending and that will assure the presence of Shriners Hospitals for Children far into the future..."

Chairman and CEO Douglas reported that we are currently spending 6.5% of our Endowment Fund value with a deficit of \$238 million in the 2011 budget.

While we wait for further updates on the status of our fiscal condition from the Leadership Conference held in Tampa on January 23, we have an

opportunity to seriously consider what each of us can do to help eliminate our budget deficits and increase our contributions. We can no longer wait for someone else, some other club or unit to carry the load and do the work.

We have 38 clubs and 16 units that comprise our Aladdin Shrine. Let's all start this year by having fun and fellowship with our brothers in the Shrine to redouble our efforts for the world's greatest philanthropy—Shriners Hospitals for Children. Can I count on you to do your part? The Children are!

The Ladies Oriental Shrine of North America was recently recognized for their contributions to Shriners Hospitals for Children®.

Members of the Thea Court (Columbus) were on hand at the Cincinnati Hospital this past month to install a plaque on the hospital's donor recognition wall. The plaque represents donations exceeding \$1.4 million dollars to the pediatric health care system of 22 hospitals.

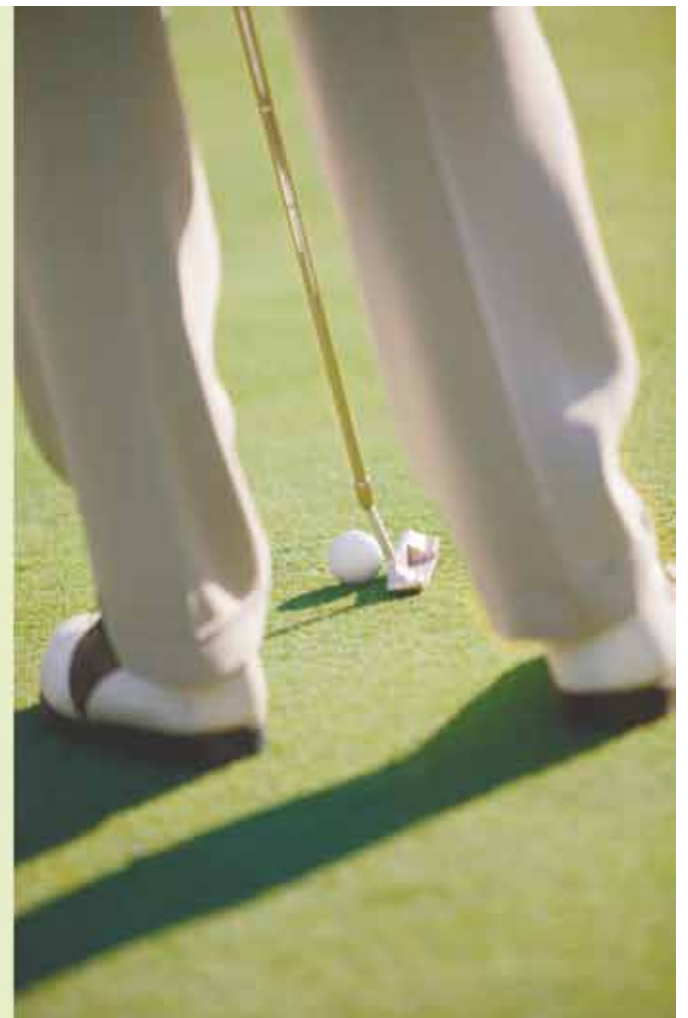
